Stories that Inspired Us

I was in fourth grade when my father abandoned us.

I could still remember the exact words my mom told us the day he left; "your Dad abandoned us, just the three of us now with your little sister Annette." Then I remembered telling her "moms don't worry, we can survive even just the three of us". From then on, she promised never to cry again because of my dad and indeed, she never cried again because of him; she started being the mom and the dad of our little family.



My mom did everything just to make ends meet. She would borrow money everywhere, even clothes and slippers she would sell just to provide us with what we need. She did all kinds of work to support us. I remember her going home every day exhausted and tired but I never heard her complain or getting angry at us. During those times that we did not have enough she will just tell us to pray and remains positive that we will survive those trials.

We went into different kinds of difficulties and she was there for us, we were there for each other as family. My mother never missed any school rehearsals or programs, from the smallest to the biggest achievements we received in school. She attended all of them, always happy to see us perform or received our awards, she made everything perfect for our small family even without a father.

Our family is perfect, even without a father we are complete.

After all those years of hardship, I realized how much my family meant to me. My mom and my sister are the most important persons to me. They are my everything, they are the reason why I am studying hard and determined to be a lawyer.

I am proud to be raised by a single parent; I don't think my sister and I would be where we are today if not for my mother.




